Late last week our fellow classmate and friend Dennis Campbell passed away. Having spent my childhood and teenage years with Dennis I wanted to share a few memories about Dennis and what growing up with him brought to many of us who did.

This last few months I have been challenging my grandchildren and myself to answer a consequential question in the middle of the pandemic - What have I learned from this tragedy that will help all of us be better people, family, friends community and nation? Dennis Campbell grew up the son of proud hardworking grain and hog farmers of Marion Township in Boone County Indiana. Dennis was even during elementary school a focused, studious, hardworking student. While some us were day dreaming; he was always learning. Always competitive; by age twelve years old he, Gail and I foot raced the dirt roads of the land we called home. There were many exhausting summer days bailing hay that he outpaced the best of us. Together we bought our first used cars cleaning hog and chicken barns side by side in the summer of 68. Those same summers we enjoyed working together on our 4-H projects and our time at the Boone County fair.

Starting in high school we shared a life long love of chemistry and history. As we both left Sheridan to continue our education at Purdue sadly we increasingly drifted apart as friends and went our own ways in our careers. Dennis the ever independent and quiet man went on to have a highly successful career in the food sector outside of Indiana. Yet just a few years ago he and his wife Phyllis returned to life and farming in eastern Indiana.
